

## Holy Communion

Your hands will be sanitized for you, You shall proceed to the altar, using the centre aisle, keeping a 2 metre distance. You shall receive the bread only, proceed to the area that is marked, remove your mask and receive Communion. You shall then place your mask back on your face, sanitize your hands again, and proceed down the side aisle nearest to you, to your seat. There will be no crossing in front of the altar. Those in the same household/bubble are encouraged to receive Communion together.

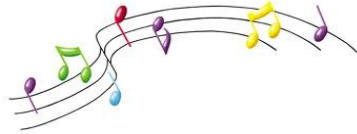
