The, fire is kindled.

then the Presider greets and briefly addresses the assembly.

A prayer is said over the new fire of Easter.

The Paschal Candle is lit from the fire.

The Presider, or a Deacon, takes the candle, lifts it high and sings:

The light of Christ.

Assembly: Thanks be to God.

The procession moves to the Parish Hall, led by the Paschal Candle. At suitable places, the candle is lifted high while the following is sung:

The light of Christ.

Assembly: Thanks be to God.

The Deacon, or a Cantor, standing near the Paschal Candle, sings or says the Canticle Exsultet.

Rejoice, heavenly powers! Sing, choirs of angels! Exult, all creation around God's throne! Jesus Christ, our King, is risen! Sound the trumpet of salvation!

Rejoice, O earth, in shining splendour, radiant in the brightness of your King! Christ has conquered! Glory fills you! Darkness vanishes for ever!

Rejoice, O Mother Church! Exult in glory! The risen Saviour shines upon you! Let this place resound with joy, echoing the mighty song of all God's people!

Assembly And also with you.

Presider Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

Assembly It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Presider It is truly right that with full hearts and minds and voices...

....Christ, that Morning Star, who came back from the dead, and shed his peaceful light on all creation, your Son who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.

After the hymn, if candles are being held, they may be extinguished or kept lit during the readings.

The paschal candle burns at all Liturgies from Easter Day through the Day of Pentecost.

Liturgy of the Word

The Presider briefly addresses the assembly. After each scripture passage is proclaimed, silence will be kept, then the psalm or hymn will be sung.

You are my portion and my cup, you make my lot always secure; My boundaries close a pleasant land, indeed my heritage is sure.


I bless the Lord who counsels me, my heart helps me to understand; I set the Lord always before, and as my guard at my right hand.
