As you prepare for worship... Proper 10B

Genesis 3:8-15: The serpent (Lucifer) deceived Eve. She, and then Adam, partake of the forbidden fruit. Note: never is it mentioned that the forbidden fruit was an apple! Her Seed (whom we know as Jesus Christ) will bruise the serpent's head. On the cross Jesus did just that. There "the ruler of this world" was condemned (see John 15:11). The roles of woman and of man are explained. Adam and Eve are cast out of the Garden of Eden. Adam must toil all the days of his life while Eve must suffer the pain of childbirth and become the mother of all people.

2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1: Paul quoted from Psalm 116, a psalm of thanksgiving (because the psalmist had been spared from death). Paul wrote that he too is afflicted, but he continues to "speak" – to proclaim the gospel – because he knows the Father will raise him as He raised Jesus, because he is (and you, dear believer, are) "in" Jesus. So, do not lose heart! Though our outer nature might be wasting away, and our earthly tent is decaying, God will bring us into His presence and give us an eternal, heavenly building.

Mark 3:20-35: This passage is early in Jesus' ministry. Up to now he has driven out demons and cured people. Just before our passage, we read that Jesus went home (no doubt he needed the rest!). Just as crowds swarmed him in Galilee, so they come to his family home. Jesus' zeal for his ministry lead some to question his sanity, and worse, leads some scribes to say he was possessed by a demon! Jesus rebuked them asking them how Satan can cast out Satan, since his actions were defeats for Satan, not victories. Then, speaking with the authority as the One who can (and will) defeat Satan, Jesus warned them that anyone who commits blasphemy by saying his actions come from Satan rather than the Holy Spirit can never be forgiven. Our reading concludes with Jesus saying he considered all who *do the will of God*, including recognizing that he healed through the Holy Spirit, to be his family.

We haven't seen many donations yet so we will change our request every few months.

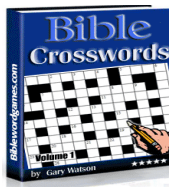
