As you prepare for worship...Easter 3C

Acts 9:1-8: In chapter 8 Saul (not yet Paul) was ravaging the Church, those who belonged to "the Way (of Christ)," by arresting them as heretics and dragging them into the Temple prison. In this reading Saul asked for authority to do the same in Damascus, but God had a different idea! Note how in persecuting the members of the Way, the risen Christ said that Saul was actually persecuting him. In the verses following this reading, Saul (blinded) is led to Damascus, to the home of Ananias, a Christian, where Saul's sight was restored and the great reversal took place: Saul was baptized, received the Holy Spirit, and became Paul, a leading a member of the Church he once persecuted.

Revelation 5:11-14: John the Divine was given a vision of what will occur at the end of the current age. He saw God's throne, the heavenly scene around it and heard the praises offered to God. In our reading today, large numbers sing of Christ's ability ("Worthy is the Lamb...") to disclose God's plans for the end times. To Christ, and to the One seated on the throne, belong all trappings of power and authority.

John 2:1-19: This chapter in John's Gospel has some depth of meaning to it. The disciples fish all night and catch nothing until Jesus tells them to lower their nets on the other side (remind you of another gospel story?). The haul of fish is great, but again, their nets do not break. They join Jesus on the beach where there is fish and bread (reminiscent of the feeding of the five thousand). Like Saul's reversal in our first reading, Peter received the blessing of having his three denials of Christ reversed when the risen Christ asked him three times if he loves him. Christ then commissioned him with "feed/tend my lambs/sheep." We will hear Jesus say that Peter's life will be cut short (tradition has it that he was crucified upside down – but even then he would not recant the resurrection of Jesus!).ext weeks readings:


