As you prepare for worship... Advent 1A

Note: Advent prepares us for the return of the Lord in Glory to complete the plan of salvation...

Isaiah 2:1-5: Spirits were low for the people of God. The Assyrian army was threatening and many doubted that God would be able to save them. The prophet told of a time when God would dwell on earth and all people would come, not to fight war, but to learn of God's ways of peace. God would settle disputes in this future age of peace and prosperity.

Romans 13:11-14: Paul wrote to the Church in Rome about the fact we live in an "in between" time, after the appearing of the Messiah but before the Kingdom comes in its fullness on the earth. So we are to live anticipating the Kingdom - laying aside the "works of darkness" and "putting on" the Lord Jesus Christ – by remembering we live in Christ and to act accordingly.

Matthew 24:36-44: Jesus has foretold the destruction of the Temple and other signs of the end times. However, none of us (not even Jesus) knows when this will take place. Rather than being preoccupied with earthly things (like those caught unaware at the time of Noah), we are to "keep awake" (pay attention) to the will of God: be ready for Christ's return!


