As you prepare for worship... Christmas 1A

Isaiah 63:7-9: This passage was written after the Babylonian conquest of 597 AD in which Jerusalem was sacked, the Temple destroyed and many of the people taken into exile. Despite the evidence to the contrary, the prophet speaks of the love God has had for His people in the past and still has to that day, how He suffered when His people suffered, and that as He redeemed and saved them once He will do so again. We hear this today because we see God's actions in Jesus, by his cross and resurrection, how He has redeemed and saved us too.

Hebrews 2:10-11; 13b-18: The author make several points about how Jesus brought about the salvation of the world, namely, through his "suffering" (his passion and death on the cross). By doing so, he has brought us to "glory" and we, called Jesus' brothers and sisters, now are sanctified and can call God our Father too. The Christ had to become a human being, in Jesus of Nazareth, in order to save all of humankind. Our reading ends by reminding us that because Christ was tested, he is able to help us when we are tested. Call on him!

Matthew 2:13-23: We hear of three instances where angels come to Joseph in dreams. (If I were Joseph, I'd be afraid to fall asleep!) First an angel warns Joseph to take Mary and the baby to Egypt (the Holy Family were refugees!) as Herod is about to slaughter all the boys aged 2 and younger, so afraid is Herod of the one born King of the Jews (Herod was granted the position, he was not born into it). After Herod died, an angel tells Joseph it's safe to return to Israel. But wait! There's more. Herod's ruthless son is ruling over Judea so an angel warns Joseph about the danger. Joseph decides to go to the relative safety (because it was far from Jerusalem, and ruled by a more benevolent king) of Nazareth in Galilee, where the Messianic prophecy that he would be called a Nazorean, would be fulfilled and Jesus and his family could live in (relative) safety.

Next weeks readings: Isaiah 60:1-6; Ephesians 3:1-12; Matthew 2:1-12

It reminded us that not all hearts are light at this time of year, and that sorrow, loss, and longing are held tenderly within our faith community. Final fund-raising total (thank you Leigh) was \$1,560 (what a great effort from the parishioners at St. Michaels) Of that money \$813.35 was spent to prepare the hampers. The remaining funds will be directed toward an Emergency Fund that can be utilized by the Mission and Outreach Committee for future needs of our parish.
