As you prepare for worship... Advent 2A

Note: Advent prepares us for the return of the Lord in Glory to complete the plan of salvation...

Isaiah 11:1-10: These words were written soon after the Assyrians conquered Israel. The prophet spoke of a future king who like David will have the Spirit of God. To this King will be given six spiritual gifts: "wisdom," "understanding" and "counsel"; he will have "might" to defend his people, "knowledge" of God's ways and "fear" (awe), i.e. proper respect for God. Under this King will be the ideal earthly harmony God intended. Finally, this King will be for all the peoples of the earth and not just Israel.

Romans 15:4-13: Paul wrote to the Church in Rome about the need for the followers of Christ to live in harmony as a reflection of God's glory. God's glory was fulfilled in Christ, first for Israel ("the circumcised") but also for the Gentiles who now glorify God too.

Matthew 3:1-12: At about 26AD John the Baptist appeared in a place where many hermits lived, calling Israel back to the ways of its Covenant with God. His message was one about the nearness of the Kingdom of God and the fulfillment of all the promises of God. John, who looked and ate like Elijah, baptized the people coming out to him, but he doubted the sincerity of the Pharisees and Sadducees (referring to them as vipers, poisonous desert snakes). He also foretold Jesus' mission to bring the Holy Spirit and to judge the ungodly.


