As you prepare for worship... Proper 4A

Micah 6:6-8: Israel is on trial for contravening the covenant with God. The wealthy and powerful were able to bribe their way to victory in Israel's courts, but now Israel finds itself in God's court. (oh-oh!) In our reading Israel pleads her case. She knows God does not want burnt offerings, rams or oil. No, God wants us, our whole selves, which demands a conversion to the point of Godliness

1 Corinthians 1:18-31: Paul continued his teaching on the cross of Christ. The cross is foolishness to the world, but for us it shows us the wisdom, love and power of God. God has continued this inverted wisdom by choosing what is foolish in the world, what is considered weak, low and despised in the world to be His Church, the People of God. Paul ended by saying if you're going to boast about anything in your life, you'd better limit it to boasting in the Lord.

Matthew 5:1-12: Jesus, seeing the crowds, went up a mountain to teach them. What we hear is commonly referred to as "The Beatitudes" (Latin for "blessed") – a wisdom that finds its source in God and His Kingdom. This, Jesus is saying, is the new era that he has come to initiate and will be fully realized one day. As the people of God, we strive (only with God's help!) to have this new mindset, revealing the Kingdom in our midst.

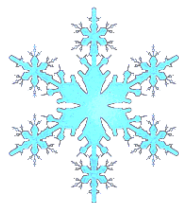
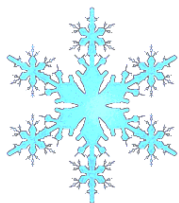

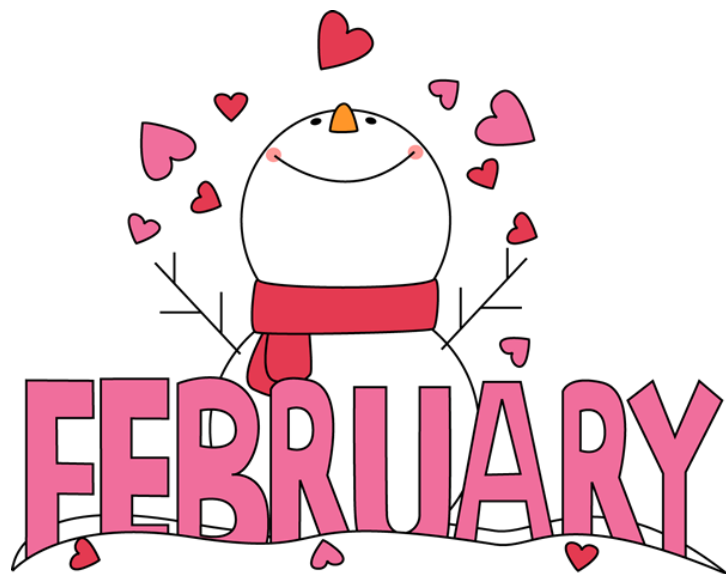
